Greetings parents, and happy summer!

This summer we have decided to issue a reading challenge to all students to read five books and complete the book report page attached. This challenge is open to all students in the first through fifth grades. The first book report page listed in this document is for students in the first and second grades and the second is for students in the third through fifth grades. All students who complete this challenge will be rewarded with a special prize on the first week back to school. Students in first and second grades can choose beginning readers, step readers, or picture books that are on their level. Students in the third through fifth grades will need to choose chapter books that are on their reading level. There is no penalty for failing to complete this challenge, but it is highly encouraged that your student participates, because even if they cannot get all five books read, students will receive credit for any book reports they turn in. We will be beginning a 40 Book Challenge this year at the lower school and we are using the summer as our kick off. Throughout the year, students will be asked to read books independently and will receive awards in increments of 5s for books they read. Students who complete all 40 books by the end of the year will receive a special treat. Any books read that have a completed book report that are turned in the first week of school will receive credit towards their goal of reading 40 books in the year.
