You are holding a dream in your hands. Many people long to do something significant to help advance God's Kingdom. Cumberland Christian Academy's founder, Larry Kendrick, is such a man. His faith and action led to something that has blessed thousands of families for the last two decades—our school. Like the church, God's schools are not simply brick and mortar, but made up of born-again believers coming together for an eternal purpose. First and foremost, CCA is about glorifying God through student development—discipling children to know and grow in Christ. God has given us several specific methods to accomplish this: Christ-centered academic and athletic excellence, outstanding missions programs, Spanish and computer training, and classes in worship arts and filmmaking.

God continues to provide excellent leadership for these programs. We have a godly school board, a talented and loving staff, and hundreds of supportive families. We are a blessed family, but as we prayerfully look at the needs of our school and community we believe God wants us to grow and build. Stakeholder focus groups tell us the number one unfulfilled desire of our community is a unified campus. Parents and teachers who drive Cumberland's multi-campus "loop" remind us of this regularly. We agree.

After years of prayer, counsel, and hard work, we present to you this Book of Dreams. It

contains the exciting plans, pictures, and maps of a dream. Like Abraham in his journey of faith, for many years CCA has "lived in tents," dreaming of a future unified, permanent home. Today this dream is within our reach.

God has placed a viable, sizable parcel of land before us. The timeline is in God's hands, but the vision is clear. Cumberland's own sports fields, library, auditorium, and a unified community are closer than ever. Many are excited about the location, size, and potential of this new property. Most of our families live west of Cobb County's East West Connector; for those who travel farther to the new property we hope to offer a bus route.

Initially our focus will be on fundraising and site preparation. Next we will see soccer and baseball played there as well as school picnics and field days. Finally, the buildings for our new campus will be constructed.

As you look through this booklet, each new building and room represents students and staff members who will be part of our growing family. Each component represents our heritage and our hopes. For example, our fine arts center will reflect generations of Christ-centered artistic excellence. We want to glorify God in the arts by training up Christian musicians, photographers, artists, and filmmakers.

In years past, key supporters challenged us that our expansion plans were not big enough. We were counseled to pray for a year, and so we did. This is our response. We do not want to limit

God. We want to dream as big as He desires, with plans that He alone be glorified through their fulfillment. We recognize that this dream is too big for us to accomplish without God, without you, and without each other.

The floor plan and site components you will see are to be built in stages, as God provides, to make maximum use of modular technologies for greater economy and utility. They are designed to have the benefits of traditional "stick built" buildings with grid ceilings, drywall, double floors, brick skirting, and custom signature awnings. These plans allow for a population of over 800, designed with careful thought to promote freedom, security, and community. And finally, they are designed to reflect Cumberland's unique needs, values, and heritage.

Cumberland's community has spoken. Our vision is to continue serving families through a growing, consolidated ministry where economies of scale allow for an affordable Christian education with excellence in academics, arts, and athletics.

Our desire is that outstanding teachers and coaches will work together to influence students throughout all grades. We want to worship together. We want the Christ-loving high school sports stars to get high-fives from the Pre-K kids. We have great plans laid at God's feet to allow new generations to be transformed. We know that "...faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." We are

trusting God for great things that will impact many generations to come. Please join us and dream with us. His plans for us are good, for us to make a difference in the world, one student and family at a time.

"How can I help?" you ask. You can help first with prayer. We need the Lord's favor, wisdom, and provision every step of the way. Secondly, with your support and encouragement—we have years of hard work (and fun) ahead. Thirdly, with your generosity—join us in giving to this vision and be a part of what God is doing here. The final cost of the project will be at least \$7 million, but God is so much greater than the need.

Today, you hold in your hands the chance to put your heart into our future and leave a legacy that lives on beyond the readers and writers of this Book of Dreams. Please prayerfully read through it and ask the Lord what He would have you do. Thank you!



## CCA's Historical Timeline



## The Beginning of Cumberland Christian Academy

*“Faith is the confidence that what we hope for will actually happen; it gives us assurance about things we cannot see.” —Hebrews 11:1*

In the late 1980s Dr. Larry Kendrick was the administrator of Smyrna Christian Academy (SCA), a school of about 300 students in grades K through 12. In April of 1989 the church that owned SCA decided to close the school at the end of May. Dr. Kendrick organized a meeting of the staff and parents to seek God’s direction. After much discussion and prayer, Dr. Kendrick led the group to explore the possibility of forming an independent Christian school. Larry believes that God gave him Revelation 3:8 as a key verse to stand on during this time:



*“I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name.”*

With no books, no school furniture, no place to meet and no money, Dr. Kendrick led the way, and

in a step of faith Cumberland Christian Academy was established. Larry encouraged the small group of founding parents and staff to trust the Lord and pray for His provision. One week before school was scheduled to start, the church agreed to rent the needed space along with books and equipment to CCA—God provided!

Over the next several years, CCA rented space from local churches in order to accommodate its growing student population. At one point the school had campuses at six different locations. In 1997 Dr. Kendrick led the charge to build CCA’s own middle school at Westside Baptist Church. Later, CCA bought and renovated the facility on Clay Road for its lower school, and the high school leased space at Trinity Fellowship.

The school has enjoyed a long history of stable leadership. After serving more than 20 years as headmaster, Dr. Kendrick retired and was succeeded by Dr. Lee Campbell. Our founding board chairman, Boyd Wages, still serves in this capacity.

From the first year with fewer than 100 students and a graduating class of ten to the present, CCA’s influence has reached thousands of students and their families for Christ.

## Cumberland Christian Academy Today

Founded in 1989, Cumberland Christian Academy is a non-denominational, K3-12th grade Christian school. Grades K3-12 are accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). In addition, CCA is “Accredited with Quality” by the Georgia Accrediting Commission for grades K-12. In a recent year, CCA’s enrollment was approximately 475 students and continues to grow. We have exceeded 90% of the capacity of our current facilities. CCA offers a college prep curriculum and provides intensive support to students with college and scholarship planning. SAT preparation is included in tuition. Standardized test scores are consistently above average across all grade levels. College acceptance for seniors has been 100% for the past several years. In one year alone, CCA students were offered almost \$1 million in scholarships. Recent acceptances have included U.S. Naval Academy, Georgia Institute of Technology, U.S. Military Academy West Point and many other state and private universities.

CCA strives to make Christian education accessible to students from varying financial and ethnic backgrounds. The student body is diverse and has included international students from countries including Latvia, Romania, South Korea, China, Spain, Nigeria, Germany and Vietnam. CCA’s student population is a clear reflection of the community it serves with a strong

representation of African-American, Caucasian, and Hispanic students.

A broad student life program presents opportunities such as homecoming, Spring formal, trips, summer camps, student competitions, etc., which are enriching to students both socially and educationally. Each Fall, 8th through 12th graders begin the year with a Christian retreat. Grades 4-12 travel overnight and grades 6-12 attend extended trips each Spring. Juniors and seniors go on an annual week-long mission trip to places such as Barbados, Antigua and places in the U.S. From chapels to retreats, from the classroom to the mission field, the Gospel of Jesus Christ is preeminent at CCA. When parents pay tuition for CCA, their payments also fully pay the salaries of Hope Academy, a missions school in Haiti.

Students can participate in contemporary worship, instrumental ensembles, photography, filmmaking, music theory, yearbook, art, as well as private lessons in voice, piano, guitar, drama and dance. Clubs include Patriot Ambassadors, Civil Air Patrol, BETA Club, International Club and Patriot Voices.

Cumberland is a member of the Georgia Independent Christian Athletic Association. CCA’s athletic program has a long history of successful competition and league championships. Sports typically offered have included basketball,

volleyball, golf, soccer, cross country, baseball, equestrian, tennis, and cheerleading.

Homeschool students in grades 9-12 are offered a broad spectrum of courses at CCA—online, in the classroom, or a combination of both—through Cumberland Christian Virtual Academy (CCVA). They may also participate in sports and school activities. CCA offers a local college’s joint enrollment classes online in the student lab.

In the summer of 2014, CCA purchased 33 acres of land with plans to build a new campus. As in the beginning, God continues to provide for His work at CCA in an amazing way. We count it a privilege to serve Him and the students He loves so much!

## Frequently Asked Questions

### When will we be one campus?

Plans are in place to build the dream as soon as funds become available. We continue to take small steps forward as funding allows, and we are trusting that God will lead you and others to help build the vision.

### What comes first?

We are hungry to build, yet classrooms and supporting infrastructure are the most expensive part due to site preparation, etc. This means we need \$3 million to begin to build. Meanwhile, sports fields, while not cheap, will allow our community to enjoy the campus.

### How many students will we accommodate?

We never want to become so big that we lose connection with the individual. We will initially accommodate 800 students with room to grow.

### Will our vision or mission change? Will we keep our focus on discipleship?

Jesus will be first. Our heart for worship, student advocacy, and discipleship, as well as our mission to be an affordable, multi-cultural school, is simply *who we are*.

### Will we have sports fields?

Yes! For the first time in our history we will have our own fields to use, share, and use as an outreach to community teens.

### How much will sports fields cost?

Cross country, at a cost of approximately \$40,000, is the least expensive but requires restrooms, concessions, and other infrastructure. Soccer (and future football) is second on the list and could probably be built in excellence for less than \$100,000 including supporting infrastructure. Baseball is the most expensive, costing \$270,000.

### How long will this take?

That depends on God and, with His leading, you!
